

CURRICULUM

Our carina staff provide feedback and will work closely with you to ensure that you grow in confidence, feel safe in your learning, and explore and discover new things.

We believe that we are best when we work together; staff, you and your family. This partnership is really important in ensuring that you feel supported and can progress to reach your full potential. There will be various opportunities for us to meet, talk and communicate. Your parents will want to know how you are doing, and so written reports acknowledging strengths and suggesting strategies for improvement are issued annually, complemented by shorter interim progress reports.

Throughout your journey at VCB you will have the opportunity to study a range of new subjects and courses, suited to your learning style and aspirations. The College pro-actively engages in the South Belfast Area Learning Community. You will be encouraged to try new things, to realise your own talents and abilities, to push boundaries and set meaningful targets so that you can progress, whilst being happy.

SCHOOL DAY

School begins bright and breezy at 8,40gm and ends at 3,10pm, with an extensive range of extracurricular activities running during and after school. You will start each morning with your form class and some days collectively you will attend assembly.

We operate a 10 day timetable over each fortnight, with six 50 minute teaching periods each day. This can take a little time to get used to, but it allows you to enjoy a range of subjects and to manage your studies at a pace that suits you. Pupils are taught in classes aligned to their Registration Group, subject choices, or alternative needs. An important part of the school day is also break and lunchtime, when you will have time to relax, catch up with friends and build your energy for more learning! The College provides both a break and lunchtime cafeteria service, providing both healthy cold and hot meals. The dining hall also accommodates pupils who bring packed lunch to school. Purchasing meals is cashless and accessed through ParentPay.

All pupils are encouraged to participate in our extensive range of extracurricular activities* including Yoga, Language clubs, Art Club, Sign Language, Bar Mock Trials, to highlight but a few. There will definitely be something that appeals to you and these activities are a great way to meet even more new people and staff, whilst enjoying school life beyond the classroom.

CAREERS

Careers Education, Information, Advice and Guidance (CEIAG) will be an interesting and integral part of your school experience. You will engage in Learning for Life and Work, covering Employability and Personal Development. You will also gain experience and understanding of the world of work and the concepts of employability and enterprise, through the taught curriculum, workshops, seminars and team building events.

Detailed advice and guidance is provided for pupils seeking to apply through UCAS and CAO for university places and those pupils exploring opportunities at FE colleges and in modern apprenticeships. There is also opportunity for work experience at the end of Year 13; mock interviews in Year 14; specific workshops and guidance for applications to study nursing and midwifery, medicine, dentistry and veterinary science.

In addition, guidance and support is provided for applications to the Queen's pathway programme, Sutton Trust, Nuffield research programme, Sentinus and similar programmes.

We like to map your unique journey and you will complete a Progress File and Career Starter e-portfolio. This involves self-evaluation, target-setting, action planning and exploration of a wide range of careers. With us, you will begin to further explore who and what you want to be.

Pupils in Years 10 and 12 are interviewed before they choose the subjects they wish to study at the next Key Stage. All pupils in Year 12 receive an interview with the Northern Ireland Careers Service and a separate interview with the Careers Department at school in order to help them to decide upon their Post 16 pathways.

PASTORAL CARE

In VCB we place pastoral care at the very heart of College life. All staff will ensure that you are safe and thriving, whilst being inspired and encouraged to be yourself, and to grow in confidence within our caring community. Our pastoral structure means that you will be known, supported and valued. We emphasize core values such as respect, politeness, kindness, and also promote inclusion and equality. You will be equipped with the confidence to have fun and be creative, to be a risk taker and to persevere in order to achieve great things.

Our door is open. If a Parent/Guardian has a concern about their child's safety, they can get in touch with a member of our experienced Safeguarding Team. We also have a Pastoral Portal on our school web page which contains many useful links for pupils and their families. Copies of relevant school policies can also be accessed via our school web page.

Our taught pastoral curriculum sits alongside weekly assemblies and key events which cover a range of topics and include sessions on online safety, positive relationships, mental health and well-being, self-esteem and good citizenship. Our well-being rooms are also used to great effect and can provide you with a place for reflection, guidance, mindful consideration and time out. Throughout your journey at VCB you will be supported by a Form Teacher and Head of Year. The College also has the expertise of a School Nurse and Counsellor for specific pastoral needs.

We appreciate that during your time with us you will mature from an 11 year old, to becoming a teenager and leaving as a young adult; and we are here to support you and your family on this journey.

MEETING YOUR NEEDS

At any given time, pupils may need additional support to fulfil their potential. When a particular need has been identified, we work diligently through our SEN Policy to monitor and implement relevant strategies and support to assist each pupil. In consultation with parents it may be appropriate that a Personal Learning Plan (PLP) is written in order to help the pupil identify focused targets. Staff will use the information and targets set out in the PLP to plan to inform their classroom practice.

An extra-curricular Homework Club on our Junior campus supports pupils in developing their literacy skills and study strategies and we avail of other extra-curricular clubs such as Lego and Meditation to help build strategies of support for the pupils identified. In terms of accessibility, due to the layout of the campus not all areas of the College are accessible for those with a disability. As a result, timetabling arrangements are made for pupils, or staff, with mobility issues to be taught in suitable accommodations.

The Special Educational Needs Policy is posted on the school website and paper copies are available, on request, from the School Office which describes in detail our whole school based approach to SEN provision at VCB. SEN is managed and run by the Senior Teacher for Learning Support and Examinations and SEN focused staff training is provided during school development days to assist with the day-to-day support needed.
